

G.3 Approve School Bus Purchase

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the purchase of seven (7) total school buses from Hoekstra Transportation Inc., as follows:"

From Hoekstra Transportation, Grand Rapids, Michigan:

- Six (6) Thomas 77-passenger school buses with integrated child restraint seats and additional cameras at \$148,125.00 each
- One (1) Thomas 65-passenger school bus with integrated child restraint seats, wheelchair lift, additional cameras at \$153,698.00 each

The total for this purchase would be \$1,042,448.00

RATIONALE: The Director of Pupil Transportation has compared the specifications of the offerings from each of the three (3) manufacturers represented in the purchasing program and has made the determination that the recommended bus models will best serve the district at this point based on the performance of our latest purchases and other comparative factors. Funding will come from the 2018 Bond Fund for this purchase.

Re: 2025 Bus Purchase

To maintain a quality bus replacement program and purchase, there are many factors to take into consideration.

We currently have seven (7) buses that are a 2012-year model. Those buses are over twelve years old and past due on replacement. They have high mileage that exceeds normal wear and tear for school buses. The underbody of these buses is rusting, and they have very high corrosion on the outside and inside of the buses. The mechanical parts are beginning to fail which leads to costly repairs.

To maintain a proper replacement cycle, we are recommending the following configurations:

- (6) 77-passenger diesel conventional buses (\$888,750.00)
- (1) 65-passenger wheel-chair conventional buses (\$153,698.00)

The following features are add-ons for the new buses:

- 1. Safety feature Warning System Driver ALERT LED sign. This safety feature cost \$466.00 per unit.
- 2. Hard wired for Zonar GPS system. This feature cost \$476.00 per unit This price does not include installation.
- 3. Provision camera system. This feature cost \$4,895.00 per unit which does include installation.
- 4. Electrocomm two-way radio. This feature cost \$1,176.00 per unit which does include installation.
- 5. Corrosion protection option to prevent rust outside, inside and the fuel tanks. This feature cost \$619.00 per unit.
- 6. Child Restraint Seating (8) total for built-in Star Seating for our ECSE students. The feature cost \$1,148.00 per unit.

From the attached pricing comparisons, Thomas Buses from Hoekstra is the lowest cost for our bus configuration compared to the next closest, Holland.

In the past decade, Chippewa Valley has purchased Thomas buses for several reasons. We have phenomenal support from the Hoekstra representatives and the dealership. We always receive exceptional professional service.

I am recommending continuing to use Hoekstra and purchasing seven new buses – Six (6) general education 77-passenger buses and one (1) 65-passenger wheelchair special needs bus. The performance and support we have received validates our decision to continue the Chippewa Valley business relationship with Hoekstra.

Specifications and quotes are provided by the M.S.B.O. Cooperative Bus Purchasing Program. The program provides the highest standards and competitive pricing.

Recommendation for Award of Bid Package Number 14.2425

(District-wide Purchase of Air Filters)

Please review this recommendation for award of Public Bid Package No. 14.2425 for the district-wide purchase of air filters for an annual filter change of once per year per building. Public bidding requirements were followed according to applicable State of Michigan laws and Board of Education policies. Aggressive bid solicitation included posting to the State of Michigan SIGMA website and direct mailing to companies.

Six proposals were opened on February 12, 2025. Bid specifications include pricing for the air filters and any shipping costs. The two lowest bidders, Filter King and Filterbuy, provided several no bids so we were unable to consider their proposals. Midwest Air Filter was the next lowest base bid price and did not provide any alternate bids.

Aero Filter's proposal was the only bidder that submitted a complete proposal which included both base bid pricing and alternate pricing on each filter item. The alternate pricing proposed was \$59,886.35, which is the lowest bid with no "no bids." Both their base bids and alternate bids proposed maintain industry standards on filtration and MERV ratings while offering competitive pricing. Additionally, the District has used Aero Filters for many years, and they have provided excellent customer service.

Therefore, the bid award is being recommended to the apparent lowest bidder, Aero Filter, for a one-year contract with the option of three annual contract extensions.

This purchase is being funded from the 2025-2026 General Fund budget.
