Board President Pearl called the Special Board meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was given.

MOTION #10/03/25 – Moved by Member Aquino and supported by Member Mahome to approve the agenda. **Yes all, motion carried.**

MOTION #10/04/25 – Moved by Member Aquino and supported by Member Mahome to approve the General Consent Agenda to:

A roll call vote was taken. Member Kuntz, yes; Member Mahome, yes; Member Pearl, yes; Member Aquino, yes and Member Radyko, yes.

The meeting was reconvened into Open Session at 6:55 p.m.

MOTION #10/06/25 – Moved by Member Mahome and supported by Member Kuntz that the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education conducted a hearing on 10/15/2025, in closed session concerning the Administration’s recommended expulsion of Student 10/15/2025-CVHS01.

The Student and the Student’s parents were advised, in writing, of the charges against the Student, the Administration’s recommendation of permanent expulsion and all other due process rights required by the law and District policy.

The Board of Education, based on evidence introduced at the hearing, concluded Student 10/15/2025-CVHS01 violated Sections *IV.10* of the Student Code of Conduct, entitled, “*Drug Possession or Use,*” and a violation of *MCL 380.1311a(1) and (2)*. The Board of Education also considered the following factors and concluded the Administration had rebutted the presumption against long-term suspension or expulsion: the Student’s age; the Student’s disciplinary history; whether the Student is disabled; the seriousness of the Student’s misconduct; whether the Student’s misconduct threatened the safety of any other student or staff member; whether restorative practices will be used to address the Student’s misconduct; and, whether a lesser intervention would properly address the Student misconduct.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED: Student 10/15/2025-CVHS01 is permanently expelled from the Chippewa Valley School District and is prohibited from entering any premises owned, operated or controlled by the District or attending any District-related function.

The student may apply for reinstatement prior to the end of the 2025-2026 school year, for reinstatement at the beginning of the 2026-2027 school year. The Reinstatement Committee shall only grant reinstatement if the student can demonstrate the student has successfully continued their education and has not been involved in any drug related offenses and the student can demonstrate continued enrollment in therapy.

A roll call vote was taken. Member Mahome, yes; Member Kuntz, yes; Member Radyko, yes; Member Aquino, yes and Member Pearl, yes.

The Student and the Student’s parents were advised, in writing, of the charges against the Student, the Administration’s recommendation of permanent expulsion and all other due process rights required by the law and District policy.

The Board of Education, based on evidence introduced at the hearing, concluded Student 10/15/2025-CVHS02 violated Sections IV.42 of the Student Code of Conduct, entitled, “*Verbally Threatening a Staff Member/Student/Person Associated with the District,*” and a violation of MCL 380.1311a(1) and (2). The Board of Education also considered the following factors and concluded the Administration had rebutted the presumption against long-term suspension or expulsion: the Student’s age; the Student’s disciplinary history; whether the Student is disabled; the seriousness of the Student’s misconduct; whether the Student’s misconduct threatened the safety of any other student or staff member; whether restorative practices will be used to address the Student’s misconduct; and, whether a lesser intervention would properly address the Student misconduct.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED: Student 10/15/2025-CVHS02 is permanently expelled from the Chippewa Valley School District and is prohibited from entering any premises owned, operated or controlled by the District or attending any District-related function.

A roll call vote was taken. Member Kuntz, yes; Member Mahome, yes; Member Radyko, yes; Member Wojtowicz, yes; Member Aquino, yes and Member Pearl, yes.

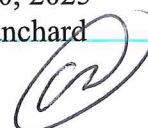

G.2 Adopt Resolution on Safe and Secure Storage of Firearms

Mr. Roberts

RECOMMENDED MOTION: “That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education adopt a resolution to promote the safe and secure storage of firearms and that the reading of the resolution be waived.”

RATIONALE: The United States Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center recommends the importance of appropriate storage of weapons. Across the country, lawmakers, community members and local leaders are working together to implement public awareness campaigns such as the *Be SMART* program which encourages secure gun storage practices and highlights the public safety risks of unsecured guns.



CHIPPEWA VALLEY SCHOOLS RESOLUTION ON SAFE AND SECURE STORAGE OF FIREARMS

A regular meeting of the Board of Education (the "Board") of Chippewa Valley Schools (the "District"), County of Macomb, State of Michigan, was held on the 20th day of October 2025 at 6:30 p.m. Eastern Time.

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Member _____ and supported by Member _____.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, in partnership with stakeholders, is committed to the safety and well-being of all students, families, and staff;

WHEREAS, in the United States, gun violence is the leading cause of death in children and teens; and

WHEREAS, as estimated 4.6million children in the United States live in households with at least one loaded, unlocked firearm; and

WHEREAS, evidence strongly suggests that secure firearm storage is an essential component to any effective strategy to keep schools and students safe; and

WHEREAS, research shows that secure firearm storage practices are associated with up to an 85 percent reduction in the risk of unintentional firearm injuries among children and teens, and

WHEREAS, the United States Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center recommends the importance of appropriate storage of weapons because many school attackers used firearms acquired from their homes, and

WHEREAS, school districts across the country have begun to proactively send materials home to parents and guardians informing them of the applicable firearm storage laws and firearm secure storage best practices; and

WHEREAS, keeping student's families, and staff safe from the threat of gun violence should be the responsibility of all adult stakeholders across the district; and

WHEREAS, in order to continue with preventive measures to increase the safety of students, families, and staff we must act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Chippewa Valley Schools will utilize available resources to communicate information about the importance of the safe and secure storage of firearms to parents and guardians across the district, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Chippewa Valley Schools will continue to work with local law enforcement agencies, health agencies, and non-profits to collaborate and increase efforts to inform District parents and guardians about safe and secure storage of firearms in their homes.
