### G.1 Approve Change Order Summary Report – June 2014 Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the 2004 and 2010 Bond Issue Change Order Summary report for the month of June 2014."

RATIONALE: This work consists of changes to existing contracts for the purpose of Owner requested work, deducts, code compliance, or hidden conditions on the construction projects. All amounts are within the contingency budget allocation.

This report was reviewed with the Building and Site Sub-Committee on Monday, July 14, 2014 and funding will come from the 2004 and 2010 Building & Site Funds.

# G.2 Approve Bid Award for Classroom Equipment for CTE Mechatronics Program

Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education award contracts to Michigan Technical Education Consultants and Future Tek, Incorporated totaling \$154,960.08."

RATIONALE: The project includes equipment required to outfit the new Mechatronics CTE Program.

This information was reviewed the Building & Site Sub-Committee on Monday, July 14, 2014 and funding is available within the 2010 Building & Site Funds.

### G.3 Approve Purchase of Laptops for CTE Mechatronics Program Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education award a contract totaling \$40,012.00 to Netech, Incorporated for the purchase of CTE mechatronics laptops."

RATIONALE: The project includes the purchase and installation of 28 new laptops to be installed and configured for the Mechatronics program at Dakota High School. The computers are being purchased utilizing the Macomb Intermediate Schools District's Cooperative Bid (MISD-PC-2012).

# G. 4 Approve Personnel Transaction-Hire of an Administrator/ Principal at Fox Elementary Mr. Roberts

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the appointment of Mr. Frank Bellomo to the position of Principal at Fox Elementary. Mr. Bellomo's effective start date will be August 11, 2014."

RATIONALE: Mr. Bellomo is being appointed to fill a vacancy created by a retirement and he meets all the qualifications specified in the posting.

## G. 5 Approve Personnel Transaction-Hire of an Administrator/Principal at Cheyenne Elementary Mr. Roberts

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the appointment of Mr. Mark Johnson to the position of Principal at Cheyenne Elementary. Mr. Johnson's effective start date will be August 11, 2014."

RATIONALE: Mr. Johnson is being appointed to fill a vacancy created by a promotion and he meets all the qualifications specified in the posting.

# G. 6 Approve Personnel Transaction-Hire of an Administrator/ Principal at Mohawk Elementary Mr. Roberts

RATIONALE: Ms. McVicar is being appointed to fill a vacancy created by a promotion and she meets all the qualifications specified in the posting.

# G.7 Approve Purchase of Band Uniforms for Chippewa Valley and Dakota High Schools

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the purchase of band uniforms from Stanbury Uniforms for both Chippewa Valley and Dakota High Schools in the total cost of \$141,443.85."

RATIONALE: Aggressive pricing was obtained through the public bidding process RFB 9.1415.

The proposals were reviewed and approved by Educational Services and Purchasing Departments. Funding will come from the 2014-15 General Fund.

### G.8 Approve Cooperative Bid Award for Purchase of Copiers

Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve a copier contract award to Ricoh USA in the amount of \$241,215, utilizing the MiDEAL bid cooperative program. This pricing is guaranteed for 12 months."

RATIONALE: Aggressive pricing was obtained through the MiDEAL bid cooperative program, of which Chippewa Valley Schools is a member. This recommendation was approved by Building & Site on July 14, 2014. Funding will come from the 2010 Building & Site Fund.

## G.10 Resolution to Participate in the Macomb Oakland Aggregate Bus Fuel Purchasing Program Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the resolution to authorize participation in the Macomb Oakland Aggregate Bus Fuel Purchasing Program and that the reading of the resolution be waived."

RATIONALE: The district has participated in the bus fuel purchasing program since its inception in the 2003/2004 school year. Aggregating fuel volume of many districts into one bid secures competitive pricing for participating districts.

### G.11 Approve School Loan Revolving Fund Resolution

Mr. Sederlund

RECOMMENDED MOTION: "That the Chippewa Valley Schools Board of Education approve the Preliminary School Loan Revolving Fund Application and Resolution and that the reading of the application and resolution be waived."

RATIONALE: School Board approval of the Preliminary School Loan Revolving Fund Application and Resolution is necessary to allow the District to meet its principal and interest payments on outstanding bonds and levy a total of 8.64 mills for debt retirement. Without access to the School Loan Revolving Fund, the District would need to levy additional millage for debt retirement.
