Dress and Grooming

- ➤ Dress and grooming must not violate reasonable standards of safety, health, hygiene, or decency, which includes the style of the clothing and anything pictured or written on the clothing or on accessories.
- > Shirts and dresses must have fabric in the front and on the sides.
- Fabric covering all private parts cannot be see-through.
- Clothing must cover undergarments.
- Shoes must always be worn.
- ➤ Hats and hoods must allow the student's face and ears to be visible to staff.
- > Students attending school functions are not allowed to wear ski masks or balaclava-style masks.
- > School authorities reserve the right to prohibit and regulate any items of clothing or personal possessions which are or could be unsafe, unhealthy, or disruptive to the regular routine of the school.
- > Students will be required to change clothing before returning to class.

Below are guidelines for appropriate dress throughout the school year.

Shoes	Must always be worn
Shirts	 Must have fabric in the front and on the sides Cannot violate reasonable standards of safety, health, hygiene, or decency, which includes the style of the clothing and anything pictured or written on the clothing or on accessories.
Pants	 Must have fabric in the front and on the sides Cannot violate reasonable standards of safety, health, hygiene, or decency, which includes the style of the clothing and anything pictured or written on the clothing or on accessories. cover undergarments
Hats & Hoods	 Must allow the student's face and ears to be visible to staff. Ski masks and balaclava-style masks always prohibited during school events Allowed in hallways and the cafeteria but must not be worn in classrooms without express consent by a teacher

Backpacks	Must be kept in locker during the school day
Shorts/ Skirts	 Must have fabric in the front and on the sides Cannot violate reasonable standards of safety, health, hygiene, or decency, which includes the style of the clothing and anything pictured or written on the clothing or on accessories. cover undergarments
Coats/ Outdoor Wear	Cannot be worn inside the building during school hours

Dress code violations are tracked in the main office. When a student receives a dress code violation the following consequences will occur:

1st – 3rd violations – warning and student must change

4th violation – detention and student must change

5th violation – 1 day out of school suspension

6th violation – 2 days out of school suspension
