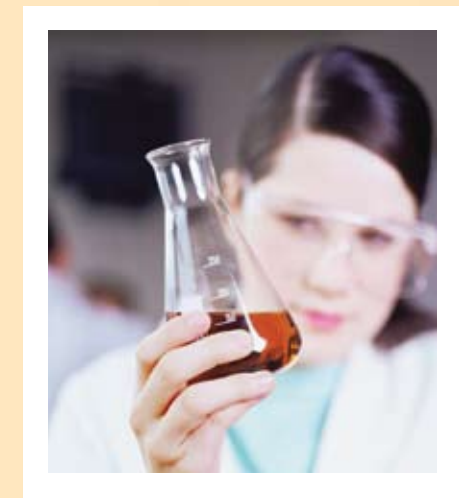
THE Scholastic Enhancement FUND
