

Frequently Asked Questions

What classes can I take?

You can take classes that are not offered at DHS or classes that do not fit into your schedule (ex. A conflict with AP Psychology and AP Environmental during the same hour).

What classes should I take?

Take classes that relate to your future; it's better to take a general education class than classes in your major if you plan to transfer. Some examples of general education classes fall in areas of Sociology, Humanities, and Philosophy.

What classes am I NOT allowed to take?

Classes that are in a hobby, craft, recreational, or in the areas of physical education, theology, divinity or religious education are not eligible for tuition support.

Can I take remote/online classes whenever I want?

Remote classes have specific times that you need to be available for online meetings. Make sure that start/end times of the classes do not conflict with your high school schedule and activities. Online classes are classes that you can take whenever you want.

Does DHS provide transportation?

No, we do not provide transportation to the college or from our school if you are leaving early or arriving late.

I'm going on vacation for mid-winter break or spring break, so I may miss a week of class. Is that okay?

Missing a week of a college class can put you significantly behind. You may want to contact the professor to see what their attendance policy is ahead of time.

What time should I schedule my college class?

You have flexibility with choosing the time of when your class will start. The class may not conflict with any high school classes and should not conflict with any sports or activities. Remember to allow yourself travel time to get to your class.

Does my counselor register me for my college class?

No, YOU MUST REGISTER YOURSELF for your class and complete all College/Macomb steps outlined for admission. Your counselor will make sure the approval form authorizing you to take certain classes at Macomb is sent to Macomb.

What if the class I put on my registration form is closed?

Contact your counselor to get approval for a different class BEFORE REGISTERING for a new class.

What if the class I registered for is dropped by the College?

Contact your counselor to get approval for a different class BEFORE REGISTERING for a new class.

What if I am waitlisted for the class that I want?

If you are not first on the waitlist, we recommend that you select a different class. If this happens, please contact your counselor BEFORE REGISTERING for a new class.

Does DHS cover the cost of books and how do I buy my books?

The costs of the college books can be funded at least partially by the school district. You must purchase them through Macomb's campus bookstore. If the district is paying for the book, the book becomes the school's property. At the end of the semester, please return the book to Macomb's bookstore. When you go to the MCC bookstore, please let them know that you are a Dual Enrollment student from Dakota.

What if I don't follow the instructions given pertaining to Dual Enrollment?

We understand that students may make a mistake in the process. Your counselor will work with you to fix that mistake. Multiple errors indicate that you are not ready to move forward and need to wait until the next semester while taking time to understand the process.
